



A refreshed Code


Vision for a refreshed Code proposed in the Code Stocktake report, building on the strengths of the existing Code

National Statistics estate: the concept of 'Families' and 'shelf-life'

- There are now about 800 sets of National Statistics (NS)
- Many sets of statistics have been designated as NS for several years, and are unlikely to be re-assessed
- There are two potential areas we are exploring around this:
 - 'Families' of statistics
 - 'Shelf-life' for the NS designation
