At 18:31 Wednesday 22nd February (pre-release day) an email was sent by a Media & Comms Officer to the Statistician (who sent the pre-release report) to approve some Lines to Take* ahead of publication date (23rd February). The Lines included statistics from the final report and indications of trends. This email was copied to a number of individuals (including two other Media and Comms colleagues) who were not on the pre-release access list. The breach was identified by the Statistician the following morning shortly before the output was due to be published at 09:30.

*Reactive lines prepared in advance of publication for potential external media enquiries.

3. Impact of the breach [guidance]

Given the timing of the email (18:31 on Wednesday 22nd February) and that output was being published the following day, the impact of the breach was minimal. No information was released externally prior to the report being published on Thursday 23rd February at 09:30.

4. Corrective actions (taken or planned) to prevent re-occurrence[guidance]

- Having been briefed on their responsibilities as a recipient of pre-release access on Tuesday 21st February, the Media & Comms Officer was notified of the breach on Thursday 23rd and told that Lines which include statistics in the final report (and indication of trends) should not have been shared beyond those on sent the pre-release email.
- MOD Chief Analyst (Head of Profession for Statistics) is scheduled to meet with the Director of Defence Communications (DDC) to re-emphasise the Code of Practice for Official Statistics.
- Responsible Statisticians have been asked to remind all the individuals involved in the production of MOD Official Statistics of the protocols for pre-release access.
- Strengthen the briefing provided to recipients of pre-release access (particularly in the Media & Comms teams) that statistics in Lines to Take and internal briefings are also covered by the pre-release access rules.
