Dear Mr Stever,

I am writing to you regarding misuse of statistics by the Labour Party relating to Universal Credit. These statistics are misleading families into thinking there is no help available to them while they transition onto Universal Credit.

In the first instance, on 6 December 2017 at 11:52, an email was sent from the Labour Party stating '40,000 children will wake up in poverty on Christmas Day because the Tories refuse to pause and fix Universal Credit'. This claim has since been repeated on the Labour Party's official Twitter account and by members of the Shadow Cabinet, including the Shadow Secretary of State for Work and Pensions. I have attached the email and snapshots of social media for your reference.<sup>1</sup>

It seems that to get to this figure, the Labour Party has taken the total monthly estimated number of households with children moving onto Universal Credit, and claimed that they will all face poverty. However:

- It is incorrect to say every household that registers for Universal Credit is already in poverty, or close to it;
- It is incorrect to claim that there is no additional financial help available. Interest-free advance payments are available within five days if families find that they are struggling;<sup>2</sup>
- It is incorrect to say that everyone who registers for Universal Credit has no other source of income. Universal Credit is an in-work benefit for 40 per cent of recipients.<sup>3</sup>

In a second instance on 14 December 2017, Labour alleged in a video on social media that 'millions of people are facing poverty, debt and eviction' as a result of Universal Credit, and that people have to wait 'six weeks before receiving their first payment'.<sup>4</sup> However:

- As above, it is incorrect to assume that everyone on Universal Credit is facing 'poverty, debt and eviction'.
- It is incorrect to say that there are 'millions' of people on Universal Credit. Up until November 2017 there were 660 thousand claimants for Universal Credit and 1.6 million claims.<sup>5</sup>
- Claimants will no longer have to wait six weeks before they receive their first payment. This was adjusted to five weeks in the Budget on 22 November 2017.<sup>6</sup>

Misleading, and hence frightening, people into thinking there is no help available to them while they transition onto Universal Credit is a serious dereliction of duty from the Opposition. I hope you ensure that this misuse of statistics is investigated and corrected immediately.






